PAGE 4 **New Veterans Hub**



I first met Scott Jeffrey when he was Chief Clerk at 10/27 Bn RSAR a few years ago, and since leaving the Army Scott has pursued a part time career as a Welfare Advocate for veterans, and is based at the Payneham/St Peters RSL. There is no requirement to be a member of the RSL or any other ESO to have access to this service. I am pleased to help Scott pass the word, and after reading the article below, you can also pass the word. Editor

David, I would like to pass on to our membership the creation of the Payneham RSL Ex-Service/Veterans Community Hub.

I am also not creating another 'Splinter' group, but just merely bring all services available to the Ex-Service Community into on place, so they don't have to travel to different locations. Also I have a big interest in how I can still help the Army Reserve here in SA.

Currently there is not a focus on the Army Reserve, and once again they are left as the poor cousins of the ARA. I want to ensure that his does not continue.

Payneham RSL has begun an ex-service/veterans' community hub.

The idea of this hub is to consolidate all services that are out in the ex-service/veterans' community, and have trained advocates in location to assist. You do not have to be a member of the RSL, or any ESO or association, to have access to this free service, but as this is run by volunteers, it does help if you do become a member of the any RSL sub-branch, not particularly Payneham.

The current opening timings are 0900 till 1200 Tuesday to Thursday, however these days might extend out to all week, depending on the numbers of people who use the facility. This facility is run by Ex-Service members and Veterans from various backgrounds so there would be a person who would be able to help. This is also a place of refuge for when you feel down and out. and you simply want a place to come to and have a quite brew and not be judged by society, and chat to other members of the Ex-Service community.

The following services that the ex-service/veterans' community hub provides are:

- 1. Advocacy services. This includes that initial interviews completed be a qualified advocate.
- 2. Completion of claims for submission to DVA.
- 3. Complete requests for access to all service and medical documents from Defence archives.
- 4. Family friendly location. There is access to the clubs Wi-Fi, and gaming consoles for the Children.
- 5. Coffee and tea facilities free of charge.
- 6. A quailed welfare officer in location for advice.
- 7. A safe location for the ex-service community can come and be around similar people, and simply just have a chat.
- 8. Small but growing library for the attendees can use at that pleasure 9. A guite place where you can sit and just simply think though issues, and know that you will not be judged.
- 10. Modern interactive equipment and up to date media facilities.
- 11. Access to State and Commonwealth agencies when required, such as DVA, SA Heath, Child Psychologist, VVCS etc 12. Provide advice on how the Discharge process works and what the different modes of discharge mean. That being the difference between Administrative and Medically discharge.
- 13. Provide some guidance on Centrelink services, on a when required basis.

This facility is for all service/ex-service/veterans' and their families to use.

Mate if you could please spread the word it would be great. It just seems that o-one really knows what to do and unfortunately we are seeing more and more of our brothers and sisters committing self-harm.

In the last 14 Months I have personally talked 17 out of self harm or suicide.

Anzac Day speech 2017 at Adelaide's Light Horse memorial By Brigadier Ellis Wayland AM RFD ED (R'td)

My Lord Mayor - Federal and State Ministers, Army mates, Ladies and Gentlemen - boys and girls

On previous Anzac Days, when I have had the privilege of giving this commemorative address, I have reminded my audience that they should not focus on the battles engraved on these pillars and slabs of granite - as important as they are in the annals of our nation's history. Rather should we focus on the spirit of the men who fought those battles whether they were mounted on horses, in tanks, or other armoured fighting vehicles, or even as one of our Light Horse regiments did in World War 1, on bicycles.

We in the cavalry always remind new recruits to our regiments that it is not what you are mounted on or in, it is what you see in your eyes and what you feel in your hearts and minds, and in your resolve to do what it takes to strive for success whilst never failing in your loyalty to your regiment and your mates.

Mateship! Now there's a word currently in the midst of an intense and bitter debate as a covey of sinecured bureaucrats - in of all places the Department of Environment – have determined that the word mateship on an Australian war memorial must be replaced with the word 'friendship' in homage to politically correct ideology.

Only some elitist who could not possibly even imagine what it was like to ride stirrup to stirrup into action in a four man Light Horse section or sweat inside a tank in a four man crew could have the temerity to prosecute this piece of politically correct humbug. Let me assert without any qualification that the word 'mate' in the military context is a quintessentially unique idiom. And, it is one which has no equal in the modern day Australian vernacular.

It is a word forged in conditions of adversity - not only in war but also in peace where soldiers team together to forge a brother-

Let us, therefore, stand this morning in front of these memorials and resolve to have the courage to stand resolute, and pledge to proudly protect the mystique of that ethereal military ethos - mateship.

I conclude my address with the last verse of a war memorial poem:


Remember us, Remember us




