Gunfire Breakfast

Many communities follow the dawn service with a 'traditional' gunfire breakfast. 'Gunfire' is a British tradition and was:

... the usual term for the early cup of tea served out to troops in the morning before going on first parade, whenever possible. In the War [WWI] recruits in training always had 'Gun Fire' supplied to them, the work before breakfast being found particularly trying. The morning gun in a garrison town suggested the name probably.

(E Fraser and J Gibbons, Soldier & Sailor Words & Phrases, Routledge, London, 1925, p. 113)

The 'gunfire breakfast' seems to have evolved from the above, and comprises whatever is available at the time—it could be 'coffee and rum' or 'stew, sausage and bread', or even 'bacon and eggs' (which is served by the War Memorial for their 'gunfire breakfast' on Anzac Day).



Anzac Day March

From cities to small towns, the march has long been the centrepiece of Anzac Day. Marches were held during the Great War, and became popular with veterans in the 1920s, to honour lost friends and publicly express comradeship. The RSL organises the marches. While it was traditional for veterans who saw active service, it was later relaxed to include those who served in Australia in the armed services or 'land armies' during the Second World War. It has been relaxed further, with some encouragement or acceptance of children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren marching, to assist aged veterans or to represent relatives. Former soldiers from allied armies have also been allowed to march.

Follow-on and Two-up

The march may be followed by reunions and lunches put on by local establishments. This is also the one day that the traditional Australian gambling game of 'two-up', or 'swy', may be legally played at venues. Bets are placed on how two pennies thrown into the air will fall. The 'Ringer' (in charge) will explain rules and betting procedures. Any persons of legal gambling age are welcome to participate. The entry on <u>'two-up'</u> from the *Australian Encyclopaedia* describes the 'game' and its origins.

As we go to print were are reliably informed that RSL Care (SA) have assisted Colin in the offer of a suburban unit which will suit his needs. It's amazing what can be done when you work together for your mates. Well done all.

Kangaroo Island (KI) is listed as No. 7 in the New York Times' latest (2023) annual 52 places to visit in the world. Impressive!

In 2019/20 Operation Bushfire Assist saw 292 10/27RSAR personnel deployed around South Australia, most to Kangaroo Island. Their herculean effort contributed immeasurably to the saving of lives, wildlife and property and has already become the stuff of legend. The melted road sign in the Warradale 3FD Rats Nest (boozer) is a stark reminder of the dangers they faced.

In my civilian role I am a catholic priest. It is in this capacity that I have been fortunate to be a regular visitor to KI, celebrating mass for



the local Catholic community based in Kingscote where there is no permanently stationed pastor. My last visit was at Christmas. And, as with every visit, I found myself overwhelmed by invitations to lunch, dinner, afternoon tea, a beer ... and the offers go on and on.

You can imagine my surprise when I discovered that other priests don't get the same star treatment! My first visit was an extended Easter stay in 2021, not long after the fires, where I was introduced as a priest who was *also* an ADF chaplain.

The philosopher Aesop argued that no act of kindness, no matter how small, is ever wasted. For the good folk of KI you can add that nor is it forgotten. My conviction that the ADF is a force for good has grown over the years. Warfighting and national defence remains at our core but a modern, ethical, trained and well equipped defence force can, in addition, be a source of hope for a community in crises.

One of the deployed Chaplain's on KI was my predecessor, Derek Croser. I plan to catch up with Derek in the next few weeks and ask him about his experiences. I will also mention the gratitude of the local Catholic community who would welcome him, a Baptist Minister into their homes, provided he first mentions that he is *also* an ADF Chaplain.







We are now fully into the swing of things up here and our teams are spread across many vessels (close hold on location...). The troops received the gifts and personalized cards from the RSAR Association and would like to join me in thanking you all for the lovely taste of home it brought. Thank you, it really means a lot to the team and we can't express how grateful we are for the work you do for the Battalion.

Our Darwin-based team (waiting their turn to hit the high seas) and I was lucky enough to have my family join us for the HUGE Christmas lunch as laid out by the Larrakeyah Senior Sailor's Mess.


