As we age we lose some friends along the way and this year we bade farewell to two of our most respected Commanding Officers when we said goodbye to LTCOL Jeff Chittleborough, the last Commanding Officer of 43rd Battalion RSAR on the 14th January, and to LTCOL Max Sanderson RFD ED, the last CO of 27th Battalion RSAR on 31st June.

Only 10 family and close friends attended Jeff's private service.

I was privileged with a number of colleagues from the Regiment to be invited to attend the private service to celebrate Max's life, and his wife Lorraine and son Wayne read inspiring tributes to the man they loved and admired dearly. Alan Hook, Geoff Laurie and Tex Ranger read the eulogy of Max's Service career, including his stint in Vietnam. Max is now at peace.

We also attended the funeral service for Lee Rossetti from Broken Hill who died suddenly on 4th April this year. Lee was a Captain in the CMF and served with 10 RSAR at Broken Hill after transferring from the Engineers.

On a lighter note, our membership has increased from 153 at this time last year to 170, and that is due to two factors. Firstly Rod attended a meeting of the Regimental Council and provided them with Application Forms, and we gained 4 new members there, and secondly we passed out Application Forms at a Battalion Training exercise and gained a further 11 new Serving members there. Out of those I expect to retain at least half after the first year.

As Secretary I have now been in this role since 2010 when Alan Hook presented me with 3 Woolworths shopping bags full of paper clippings and a stapler and said "It's just for 3 years, It'll be fun" he said! So, earlier this year I asked my Assistant Secretary Corey Skapin to take over the printing and distribution of our hard copy newsletters, and he has carried out this task with vigour. I think 😊

Apart from having to move our houseboat to higher moorings, and walking through ankle deep water to get to our cars we fared far better than others upstream, who lost everything. I thank those of you who enquired about our welfare, and also the many offers of accommodation should they be needed.

To the Serving Members who are on the committee, I thank you for your support. I know you are juggling your full time jobs, plus private lives and your association work, but guys, we've all been there and done that. It's not impossible, but thank you anyway. Thanks to Jesse Humphrys for his work as Webmaster, Chris Bennett for his work as Treasurer, Corey Skapin as Assistant Secretary, Des Hawkins as Vice President and Historical Officer. Mark Blondell, Michael Abraham and David Portakiewicz for the work with

their groups, and of course, Padre Paul Ghanem for keeping us all dry and bulletproof. Final thanks go to our President Rodney, who has once again fought gigantic health problems to put this Association first. He deserves more medals!

Rod has been very busy, as he will tell you, and he has organised 3 catering functions for the Battalion this year so far, with the fantastic help of Chief Baitlayer Col Abel, and they have all been well received by the soldiers. We still need more help carrying out this task.

Finally I would like to thank you, the members who keep turning up for training exercises to help out; to AGMs to cast your vote; and to the 10th/27th Battalion OPS staff who have such faith in us to do what we do.

Treasurer’s Report – AGM 2023

Good morning members of the RSAR Association,
I would firstly like to thank both our President, Rod Beams, and Secretary, David Laing for their hard work with the Association which has made my task as Treasurer more manageable. I truly wouldn't be able to do my role as effectively if it wasn't for their assistance and support.

We had a very busy last 12 months coming out of the effects of COVID and with the impact of the River Murray floods. Both have affected most of us personally and it was great to see the Association continue its work and support each other.

I note that some of our members continue to pay the association by cheque, and while we will continue to accept these forms of payment, the Australian Government has announced that it will 'wind down' the cheque system in Australia by no later than 2030. Please consider doing an electronic bank transfer of your payment directly to our account. Our bank details are published in every SITREP, on our website or are available upon request.

I have also changed my address since moving house earlier in the year and have a PO Box for you to direct your financial mail to. If you are sending me cash or cheques by mail, please use the updated address or else I won't receive your money.

Our General Account recorded a deficit of \$810.44, which has eventuated due to our website costs being 2 yearly payments, increase in insurance premiums. While a deficit, this is off a very strong surplus of \$2,894.36 for the previous financial year.

The Band Account recorded a deficit of \$1,175.50 which was largely due to the purchase of a mixing desk. Outside of the mixing desk the band was relatively neutral in terms of costs and revenue.

I commend the Treasurer's report to you the members of the RSAR Association.

The crowd was so large that we had to organise a further 50 chairs from Keswick just to seat everyone.

We have also employed the Parent – Son rule to our recruiting tactics, with Jonathan Heath having a son in March (unfortunately he can't be here today as he is performing at a Service this morning in Elizabeth).

Jonathan has also had a big month as he was promoted to full CPL last week giving him just enough time to sort his uniform before the Freedom of Entry this Saturday. Also, Nicole Weepers our drummer is due to give birth to a little boy next week.

A highlight for me this year was receiving 2 New Banner boxes from Rod Beames and the Association, as the 40 year old box the Band had unfortunately had a slight accident and didn't fare to well against Gravity as it fell off the back of the truck at the start of the year.

The Band will continue to remain extremely busy until the end of the year. The Band already has 12 tasks booked until the battalion Stand down period, with more coming in every week.



Historical Officers Report 2023

For RSARA AGM 6 Aug. 2023

Hopefully the majority of you will know that not only am I the Historical Officer for the Association, but also as Curator of the RSAR Historical Collection after taking over from Jeff Ayles some 5 years ago.

There is a fair bit of work involved, but both positions do complement each other and allows me access to more wide ranging resources in regards to undertaking research.

But, firstly as curator for the Historical Collection, it would be remiss of me not to acknowledge the help and valuable assistance of my fellow team members:-

- Heather Phillips who has had to put up with typical teething problems the installation of any new software always seems to present, in this case associated with the Museums new Mosaic Data base.
- To Martin Forsyth and Bob Cotton who, without their dedication we would be nowhere near to the 10,000 Object Data Records which are required by the museum to be written up for every single item in both the Gray & RSAR Collections.
- The same can be said of Jim Thomson who sadly due to ill health is unable now to make it into the museum.
- And finally to my wife Lynn for putting up with the countless hours I spend working at home on either Museum stuff or research queries.

This year the RSAR team have spent several months assisting with the audit of every artefact that is on display in the main museum building at Keswick. It's something that Jeff Ayle's and I were about to start before his untimely passing early last year, the result of which is now we have the almost impossible task of trying to establish who owns what.

One success story is that we have managed to see our WW1 10th. Bn. War trophy – the 77mm German Field Artillery piece finally placed on display at the front of the present 10/27 BHQ. During the course of the year I have received numerous e-mails and phone calls requesting assistance with some form of RSAR research. Recently a Russell Mehan from WA currently researching a story that was published in the AWM book 'Stand Easy 1945'. There is a story that recounts an incident involving two 2/10 Bn. Soldiers at the Old Buna airstrip late December 1942. Together we have hopefully finally identified the individuals concerned.

The latest was from a family friend of assoc. member Barry Mitchell who after many years wished to re-establish contact. Two days later another e-mail requesting if I had any further info on a 2/27th. Bn. Cpl. MID who later served in Korea.

Also thanks to the secretary, we now have the medals of SX1716 Cpl. Stephen Jefferys 2/10th Bn. in our collection which otherwise may have ended up being discarded.

Given we are not sure what the future holds for the Museum or the RSAR collection at this point in time we will continue to help preserve and document what we can of our history. Finally and most importantly since none of us are getting any younger, we need to start looking for someone to understudy my role as curator for the Historical Collection at the Museum.
